




Vendor Managed Inventory (VMI) Definition

- The buyer and the supplier establish collaborative replenishment processes to reduce inventory required for a given service level
 - The supplier manages inventory to a mutually agreed MIN/MAX levels at a selected VMI hub
 - The supplier maintains ownership of inventory until the buyer requests delivery for consumption (e.g., through a pull signal)






Why do VMI

- VMI programs deliver benefits to all by reducing inventory and transaction costs in the supply chain, while minimizing lost sales
 - 75% to 85% reduction in buyer inventory;
 - 30% to 40% reduction in supplier inventory
 - 50% to 80% reduction in stock-outs
 - 1% to 2% increase in business with strategic partners for all parties
 - 80% to 90% reduction in transaction costs for both buyers and suppliers

Why have a VMI Program

"Leave it to the experts they are better at this"

- 336 Maquilas in Juarez alone
- Avg. Inventory is 12 Million
- Avg. Inventory accuracy is 98%
- 2% = \$24,000 You can save per/Inv/turn = at 1.5 months x 8
 = \$192,000 per year

Note: 2 % represents inventory discrepancies, mysterious disappearances, damages, obsolete, lost material, inventory adjustments




